Our brothers in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Bn, 15<sup>th</sup> FA returned from Iraq on 14 February 2004. But they are back in Iraq again along with the 2<sup>nd</sup> Brigade Combat Team from the 10<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division (Mountain). They're attached to the 1<sup>st</sup> Cavalry Division in support of their efforts to combat terrorism and help bring democracy to that war torn country. In future newsletters we'll let you know what types of missions they're involved with on a daily basis. But I can tell you that direct Artillery Support is only about 20% of their mission. Their other missions are non-traditional for Field Artillery units and they're definitely in "Harm's Way" every day. I called and talked with LTC Mike Albaneze in Iraq and he'll be providing us with updates and hopefully some pictures periodically. Those are our guys over there and they need our moral support and our prayers. The Christmas Holiday season is just around the corner and we're asking for each one of you to think about your time in the service and what it was like to be thousands of miles from home during the holidays. We're asking you to please send cards with a short note about who you are, your affiliation with the 15<sup>th</sup> FA Regiment, and your wishes for their safe return. Or whatever words come to your mind for these young men. I still remember the small package that I received in Vietnam that was simply addressed to "Dear Soldier" with some small gifts, cookies, candy and a card thanking me for my service. I get a tear in my eye just thinking about that gesture of concern, respect, and love from a fellow American. ### VETERAN ADMINISTRATION CLAIMS Disability & Compensation Medical and Personal Records Information, Red Tape and Short-Cuts What's Required of YOU !!



<u>What's Compensable?</u> ANY injury to you during your service time, NOT just in Vietnam! If an old injury is bothering you, file a claim. It's much easier to win a claim IF the injury is noted on your medical records. Don't have your medical records?...you should have them!

<u>Medical Records & Personal 201 File:</u> Send to the National Archives: National Personnel Records Center, Military Personnel Records, 9700 Page Ave., St. Louis MO. 63132-5100. Include a copy of your DD-214 Discharge and use a Standard Form 180 available from any service org. or Internet at http://www.archives.gov/research\_room/vetrecs/ Your medical records may be at a local VA now.

<u>Filing a Claim:</u> It's best to have a County Veteran Service Officer (usually found in the whites pages phone book under government offices) or various Veteran organizations to file for you. DON'T do this yourself! A Service Officer should know the CFR Title 38 Book of VA Claims and what code and percentage to file for. Don't belong to a Vet organization, join one. CFR Title 38 can be purchased at Gov't Bookstores or http://www.access.gpo.gov/nara/cfr/waisidx\_99/38cfr4\_99.html

<u>Burdon of Proof:</u> Although the VA does now have to help you locate records, it's up to you to provide as much info as possible. Along with your service records, provide any past doctor visits info.

<u>PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder)</u>: This type of claim is a "Mental Wound" and requires more than average proof from you. A "Stressor Medal" (Purple Heart, Silver or Bronze Star) awarded to you usually opens the door to a better chance of compensation. The VA assumes a Vet that received this type of award seen MORE than the "average stress" than those without. This alone separates the normal from most stressed experiences in a war zone.

NO Stressor Medal: Those without a stress medal have to prove they experienced more than the average Joe. "Witness Letters", copies of "After Action" and "Officer's Daily Log" reports that show enemy action at the time and location can help show you witnessed stress in service. The Internet provides a vast amount of info as to enemy action and locations, as well as our web site. There are Vets that have no Stressor Medal that have won claims, they just require much more proof and documentation. Vet Org's that have best results for PTSD claims are: best to worst: Mil. Order of the Purple Heart, Disabled American Veterans, Amer. Legion, VFW, Vietnam Veterans of America. Stressor Letter: ALL Vets who file for PTSD are required to write a stressor letter. Your letter must explain all stressor experiences you had and how each one effected you and changed your life from the time before you entered a war zone. Spouses, children, comrades, and friends can write letters. Good Web Sites on PTSD: Read ALL info prior to filing! NO Computer? **Disability Percentages:** You want to file for the highest percentage from the get-go. Multiple percentages added to prior percentages do NOT add up as you may think! A 50% added to a 50% equals 75%, rounded off to 80%! This involves the way the VA considers a disability. A Vet with a 50% disability is considered to be able to perform 50% of the jobs in the job market. A 100% disabled Vet is UN-Employable! Claims, if won, are paid back to the date filed.
